



Publishing & Editorial Policies

Defence Scientific Information and Documentation Centre (DESIDOC) of Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO), bring out three international, open access, research journals.

1. Defence Science Journal
2. Defence Life Science Journal
3. DESIDOC Journal of Library and Information Technology

Following are the major DESIDOC publishing and Editorial Policies:

➤ Open Access Policies

- The published article is made freely available, immediately to everyone
- Article Processing Charges (APC): No fee is charges for publication
- Author (s) are permitted to self-archive the published version permanently
- The articles of journals are licensed under [Creative Commons](#) License: CC [Attribution-Noncommercial-No Derivative Works 2.5 India](#)

➤ Peer-Reviewed Process

We follow double-blind review, which means that both the reviewer and author identities are concealed from each other throughout the review process. The review system follows minimum two-round of the independent peer-review process. Journal makes full confidentiality among authors and reviewers and does not take biased decision. Our editorial team takes comments/opinion of minimum two reviewers on a manuscript before taking any decision.

➤ Submission Policies

- When you submit a manuscript, we will take it to mean that the manuscript has not already been published or submitted elsewhere. You may not submit your manuscript elsewhere while it is under consideration at DESIDOC journals.
- The primary affiliation for each author should be the institution where the majority of their work was done and amount of actual work of each should be reflected in the Contributors. If an author has subsequently moved, the current address may also be stated.
- We reserve the right to reject a paper even after it has been accepted, if it becomes apparent that there are serious problems with its scientific content, or our publishing policies have been violated.



➤ **English Language**

- All manuscripts must be presented in native standard English. Authors for whom English is a second language are encouraged to seek assistance in writing from a native speaker. Manuscripts written in poor English will not be sent for review.
- The author has to submit a '*Language Editing Certificate*' from any professional agency or a native English-language expert, whenever the editorial team asked for it.

➤ **Confidentiality and Pre-Publicity**

- We believe, that the submitted manuscript and all communication with authors and reviewers as confidential. Authors must also treat communication with us as confidential; correspondence with journal, referee reports and other confidential material must not be posted on any website or otherwise publicized without prior permission from the DESIDOC, regardless of whether or not the submission is eventually published.
- Presentation and discussion of material submitted to DESIDOC journals at scientific meetings is encouraged. Authors are free to publish abstracts in conference proceedings and to distribute preprints of submitted or 'in press' papers to professional colleagues, but not to the media. Material in a contribution submitted to DESIDOC journals may also have been published as part of a PhD or other academic thesis.

➤ **Availability of Materials and Data**

- An inherent principle of publication is that others should be able to replicate and build upon the authors' published claims. Supporting data must be made available to Editorial Board Members and reviewers at the time of submission for the purposes of evaluating the manuscript. Reviewers may be asked to comment on the terms of access to materials, methods and/or data sets; we reserve the right to refuse publication in cases where authors do not provide adequate assurances that they can comply with the publication's requirements for sharing materials.

➤ **Digital Image Integrity and Standards**

- High-resolution images are required at the initial submission. When a paper is accepted, the publishing team will request high-resolution files suitable for publication. All digitized images submitted with the final revision of the manuscript should be minimum 300 DPI or as requested by publishing team.
- A certain degree of image processing is acceptable for publication (and for some experiments, fields and techniques is unavoidable), but the final image must correctly represent the original data and conform to community standards.
- Images gathered at different times or from different locations should not be combined into a single image, unless it is stated that the resultant image is a product of



time-averaged data or a time-lapse sequence. The use of touch-up tools, such as cloning and healing tools in Photoshop, or any feature that deliberately obscures manipulations, is to be avoided.

- When submitting revised final figures upon conditional acceptance, authors may be asked to submit original, unprocessed images.

➤ Correction and Retraction

Publishable amendments must be represented by a formal online notice because they affect the publication record and/or the scientific accuracy of published information. Where these amendments concern peer-reviewed material, they fall into one of three categories: erratum, corrigendum or retraction.

- **Erratum**- Notification of an important error made by the journal that affects the publication record or the scientific integrity of the paper, or the reputation of the authors or the journal.
- **Corrigendum**- Notification of an important error made by the author(s) that affects the publication record or the scientific integrity of the paper, or the reputation of the authors or the journal.
- **Retraction**- Notification of invalid results. All co-authors must sign a retraction specifying the error and stating briefly how the conclusions are affected, and submit it for publication. In cases where co-authors disagree, the publishing team will seek advice from independent reviewers and impose the type of amendment that seems most appropriate, noting the dissenting author(s) in the text of the published version.

➤ Copyright and Licensing

DESIDOC is the copyright holder of all the contents published the DESIDOC journals. Prior permission is required from the DESIDOC if more than permissible content is reproduced in any form for publication with any publisher. However, DESIDOC provides permission to its author(s) over digital copies of articles authored/co-authored by them under <http://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-nd/2.5/in> (Creative Commons Attribution - NonCommercial - NoDerives 2.5 India).

You are free to:

Share — copy and redistribute the material in any medium or format

Under the following terms:

Attribution — You must give appropriate credit, provide a link to the license, and indicate if changes were made. You may do so in any reasonable manner, but not in any way that suggests the licensor endorses you or your use.

Non-Commercial — You may not use the material for commercial purposes.
